Kids In Charge! The Children's Science Center at MOSI

Science to Go Store, with staff to help select and carry items

- Family restrooms, wheelchair accessible
- Classroom, wheelchair accessible
- Two themed birthday party rooms, wheelchair accessible

Kids in Charge Exhibits

- Bed of Nails – lay down on 3,000 nails or just touch the nails
- Finger Prints – touch models of various fingerprint patterns
- 12 Brain Teasers – tactile, wheelchair accessible
- Bone Yard – put a model of a human skeleton together (tactile and wheelchair accessible)
- MOSI Saurus – touch models of teeth of herbivores, omnivores, carnivores
- Body Investigators – physical/tactile activities testing balance, endurance, strength and flexibility
- Publix Fields to Meals – role play growing food, stocking shelves and deli counter at Publix

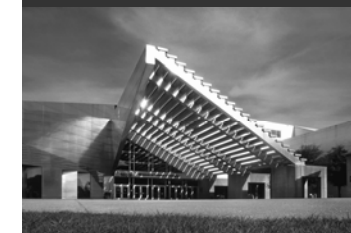


Accommodations for Persons with Disabilities

Box Office in MOSI Lobby

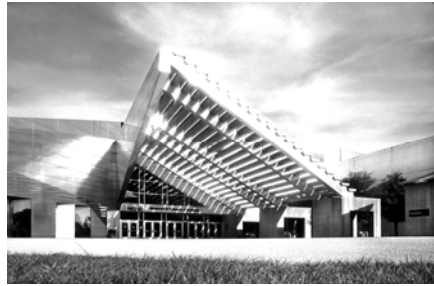
- Low counter available for guests using wheelchairs or scooters

Disasterville Exhibition

- Earthquake, Tornado, Hurricane and Wildfire rooms (4 multi-sensory experiences; video and audio; accessible by wheelchair and scooter)
- Roll your wheelchair up behind the desk of the emergency manager for a photo opportunity
- Bay News 9 *WeatherQuest* (wheelchair accessible)
- Model of largest hailstone ever recorded
- Car with hundreds of hail indentations to touch and to see



3rd Floor

- Accessible bathrooms in corner, near the surgery and nutrition areas
- Written summaries available from presenter, on request, for the Coleman Science Works Theater presentations and floor demonstrations
- Pilot's View – see or touch controls of an airplane, not wheelchair accessible
- Surgery – audio-video of heart surgery projected onto plastic patient model

4th Floor

Accessible Entrance to the IMAX® *Dome Theatre*

- 2 - 3 spaces for guests using wheelchairs or scooters just inside each of the two 4th floor entrances to the IMAX® *Dome Theatre* (4-6 spaces total)
